### ***Edith Jucker***

*Mrs. Jucker was born in Poland shortly before World War II began. When she was a young child, her family attempted to escape Nazi persecution. Fleeing on a small boat, she and family members were arrested by Russians and accused of being spies. They were sentenced to the frigid wasteland of Siberia, without running water, heat and very little food. Incredibly brave journeys through multiple countries led her to Israel, where she met her husband and eventually made a new life in Houston, Texas.*
